SYLLABUS FOR





This syllabus imagines the process of learning outside the strict boundaries of institutions, examinations, and formal schooling. Affect theorist Kathleen Stewart proposes the idea of atmospheric attunements to name the "always commonplace labor of becoming sentient to a world's work, bodies, rhythms, and ways of being in noise, light, and space... [a]n attention to the matterings, the complex emergent worlds, happening in everyday life." Texts on the syllabus offer tools and perspectives for cultivating love, and specifically a Black love as an extra-ordinary everyday practice of being with self and being in the world. What can Black love, as it emerges in literature, films, performance, and the politics of living, teach us about liberation, citizenship, and beauty? With an emphasis on genealogies of feminist and queer theories of gender, this syllabus for Black love invites readers, viewers, and the curious learners to engage the quotidian world of the senses as political pedagogy.






of self love as resistance.
